Training Wheels is a Hadassah-sponsored program that provides a foundation of Jewish learning for children ages 2-5 and their families. There are nine classes, each corresponding with a Jewish holiday or observance. Each class typically consists of an opening Alef-Bet song, discussion of the holi-

day, art projects that reinforce holiday and Jewish traditions, a mini-Shabbat celebration, story, and a closing activity that ties the lesson together. Activities include fun things like Israeli dancing, games and baking. The goal is for the family to have fun, meet other friends, and incorporate Judaism into day-to-day life.

The program meets monthly at Congregation Sha'are Shalom in Leesburg. The first class celebrates the High Holidays

on September 13th, followed by Sukkot on October 18th and Shabbat & Simchat Torah on November 8th.

## Day Off the Hill

Hadassah members participated in a "Day off the Hill" with 10th District Congressional representative Frank Wolf. Sponsored by the Jewish Community Relations Council, this event was held on August 4th at Congregation Sha'are Shalom, in the first such session with members of the Jewish Community in Loudoun County. The congressman answered questions related to the concerns of various Jewish organizations.

Congress has adjourned with many of the issues supported by Hadassah unresolved. While most attention has been placed on the Health Care reform, there are other bills pending that deserve our attention. Senator Amy Klobuchar of Minnesota has introduced the Breast Cancer Education and Awareness (S994) to increase awareness of the risk of breast cancer in young women. It will direct the Centers of Disease Control to develop and implement a national education campaign targeting women under 40 and their doctors.

The emphasis will be on identifying those women with a predisposition to breast cancer because of ethnic background or genetic mutations. Similar legislation (HR 1740) has been introduced in the House by Representative Debbie Wasserman-Schultz of Florida.

The issue of breast cancer is of particular importance to Hadassah. Studies have found that approximately 2.3 % of individuals of Ashkenazi Jewish descent have an altered gene in a frequency that is roughly 5 times greater than that of the general population. Mutation in these genes may result in an increased risk of breast and/or ovarian cancer.
